#### The Program

The Michigan Out-of-Doors Youth Camp is held for six weeks during the summer at the Cedar Lake Outdoor Center near Chelsea, MI. Our camp is special because it focuses on engaging campers in the outdoors and connecting them with the environment. Our unique curriculum teaches outdoor skills such as riflery, orienteering, camping and wilderness survival.

During their week at camp, campers dive into hands-on nature experiences and self-discovery in order to increase their knowledge of ecological concepts and broaden their awareness of conservation issues. Of course, there will also be opportunities to practice technical skills such as fishing and wilderness survival, along with time spent on the rifle and archery range. Our inquiry-based curriculum allows campers to investigate the natural world around them while gaining new skills and confidence in the outdoors. This focus on Michigan's natural resources and each person's role in the environment is what sets us apart from a typical summer camp. Campers are kept in small groups to ensure they receive individualized instruction and to keep each camper safe while in our care. Extensively-trained staff members work to deliver quality instruction and are held to the highest standards at all times.

Our goal is for campers to return home feeling positive about their experience and excited about the new skills they learned while at camp.

#### The Outdoor Center

Michigan United Conservation Clubs has operated summer youth camp programs since 1946. During this time, more than 58,000 youth have learned to enjoy the outdoors safely and have left camp with a deeper appreciation and respect for the natural world. Completed in 1940, the Cedar Lake Outdoor Center is rich in Michigan history. It was built by the Civilian Conservation Corps and has been maintained by the DNR and MUCC in the years since. The rolling landscape, white pine forest and waterfront all provide an abundance of wildlife and beauty.

We are privileged to call Cedar Lake home and have spent a great deal of time and effort restoring the facilities and making improvements to the camp for the enjoyment of our campers. We are located within the beautiful Waterloo State Recreation Area, and our property spans 225 acres, including beachfront access to Cedar Lake. With the help of countless volunteers, the staff and our awesome campers, we have been providing quality conservation education programs and connecting kids to the natural world around them for 75 years.

We couldn't be happier to be a part of the historic Cedar Lake Outdoor Center, and that pride shows in the place we call home. We are excited to have your youth join us for the 2021 season and be a part of our continued growth!

#### The Staff

Michigan United Conservation Clubs carefully recruits its camp staff from colleges and universities throughout Michigan and around the country. We select candidates who have knowledge of conservation, outdoor skills and environmental education, as well as demonstrate a mature and responsible attitude.

Background checks are completed for all staff hired, and participation in a week-long training session is mandatory. During training, our camp staff learns various teaching techniques, camper motivation, behavior management, leadership and emergency procedures, in addition to the many different curriculums they will be instructing. The waterfront personnel and leadership staff all meet or exceed the requirements of the Department of Licensing and Regulatory Affairs for the State of Michigan. We are proud of the staff at the Cedar Lake Outdoor Center and assure you that the utmost care will be taken to provide a safe and encouraging atmosphere for your child at camp. As a State of Michigan-licensed program, we not only meet the requirements of several inspections, we strive to go above those requirements in order to deliver the best experiences for your child.





### **WEEK 1: CONSERVATION CONNECTION** 6/28/21-7/2/21 — AGES 5-14, 9 A.M. TO 4 P.M.

Occasionally, we will put our poles down to enjoy a lesson in water ecology or construct our very own lures! Campers will also have opportunities to learn survival skills, archery and plenty of other outdoor activities. Parents must provide a packed lunch and swimsuit each day.

## **WEEK 3: WILDERNESS SURIVAL** 7/12/21-7/16/21 — AGES 5-14, 9 A.M. TO 4 P.M.

This is a chance for our campers to get back to the basics of wilderness survival! This camp will go from training on our 3-D archery range to constructing shelters using only what our white pine forest provides them. Our curriculum will further each camper's understanding of the survival resources available, no matter the situation. Campers will also have opportunities to learn about some of our ecosystems, archery and plenty of other outdoor activities. Parents must provide a packed lunch and swimsuit each day.

## **WEEK 4: CONSERVATION CONNECTION** 7/19/21-7/23/21 — AGES 5-14, 9 A.M. TO 4 P.M.

#### **WEEK 6: WETLANDS** 8/02/21-8/06/21 — AGES 5-14, 9 A.M. TO 4 P.M.

Michigan is the Great Lakes state! This camp is designed to get our campers out and exploring the water. Campers will visit and learn about bogs, swamps, inland lakes, ponds and the Great Lakes. We will examine aquatic plants, catch macroinvertebrates, search for reptiles and amphibians and do some fishing to to get a better look at fish. We will also learn about kayaking, survival skills, wildlife surveys, hiking, archery and more! Parents must provide a packed lunch and swimsuit each day.

\*Camp Programs are assigned based on each weeks' themes and age group. A few examples of these activities include, but are not limited to, Canoeing/kayaking, fishing, archery, fire building, shooting sports, wild edibles, hiking, arts and crafts, camp games and guest speaker presentations.

## Early Drop Off Late Pick Up

We understand that the parents of our campers might have very busy lives and that the 9 a.m. to 4 p.m. camp time slot might not work for everyone. Thus, we are offering early drop off and late pick up. Early drop off will begin at 8 a.m. and run until regular drop off starts at 9 a.m. Late pick up will begin when normal pick up ends at 4:15 p.m. and all campers must be picked up by 6 p.m.

Early Drop off: \$25/child/per week

Late Pick up: \$35/child/per week.

Picking and choosing individual days is not an option. To sign up for early drop off or late pick up you must sign up for the whole week.

#### IS PAYMENT REQUIRED AT TIME OF REGISTRATION?

Yes. Due to a high registration demand, we require payment and registration paperwork to reserve a space for your camper. Spaces are available on a first-come-first-served basis. We take credit card or check by mail. Please do not mail cash! MUCC has a strict no refund policy for all campers. You can also register online, www.mucccamp.org

#### ARE THERE SCHOLARSHIPS AVAILABLE?

Some limited scholarships are available through the generous contributions of our members to those families in need. You may contact MUCC Camp Director Max Bass at the MUCC office if you would like to apply for assistance.

#### WILL ANY MEALS BE PROVIDED TO MY CAMPER?

No. Part of our risk managment for COVID-19 is to minimize shared spaces. We will not be opening our kitchen or dining hall for meals. Please be sure to feed your camper a healthy breakfast and pack them lunch each day. We will open up our camp store every afternoon for snacks.

#### Release, Indemnifcation and Hold Harmless Agreement:

In consideration of participating in camp activities, and for other good and valuable consideration, I hereby agree to release and discharge from liability arising from negligence Michigan United Conservation Clubs and its owners, directors, officers, employees, agents, volunteers, participants and all other persons or entities acting for them (hereinafter collectively referred to as "Releasees") on behalf of myself and my children, parents heirs assigns, personal representative and estate and also agree as follows:

I acknowledge that participating in camp activities involves known and unanticipated risks which could result in physical or emotional injury, paralysis or permanent disability, death and property damage. Risk include but are not limited to, contracting COVID-19, broken bones, torn ligaments or other injuries as a result of falls or contact with other participants; death as a result of drowning or brain damage caused by near drowning in pools or other bodies of water; medical conditions resulting from physical activity; and damaged clothing or other property. I understand such risks simply cannot be eliminated, despite the use of safety equipment, without jeopardizing the essential qualities of the activity.

I expressly accept and assume all of the risks inherent in this activity or that might have been caused by the negligence of the Releasees. My participation in this activity is purely voluntary and I elect to participate despite the risks. In addition, if at any time I believe that event conditions are unsafe or that I am unable to participate due to physical or medical conditions, then I will immediately discontinue participation.

I hereby voluntarily release, forever discharge, and agree to indemnify and hold harmless Releasees from any and all claims, demands, or causes of action which are in any way connected with my participation in this activity, or my use of their equipment or facilities, arising from negligence. This release does not apply to claims arising from intentional conduct. Should Releasees or anyone acting on their behalf be required to incur attorney's fees and costs to enforce this agreement, I agree to indemnify and hold them harmless for all such fees and costs. I represent that I have adequate insurance to cover any injury or damage I may suffer or cause while participating in this activity, or else I agree to bear the costs of such injury or damage to myself. I further represent that I have no medical or physical condition which could interfere with my safety in this activity or else I am willing to assume – and bear the costs – of all risks that may be created, directly or indirectly, by any such condition. In the event that I file a lawsuit, I agree to do so solely in the state

where Releasees' facility is located, and I further agree that the substantive law of the state shall apply. I agree that if any portion of this agreement is found to be void or unenforceable, the remaining portions shall remain in full force and effect.

By signing this document, I agree that if I am hurt or my property is damaged during my participation in this activity then I may be found by a court of law to have waived my right to maintain a lawsuit against the parties being released on the basis of any claim for negligence. I have had sufficient time to read this entire document and, should I choose to do so, consult legal counsel prior to signing. Also, I understand that this activity might not be made available to me or that the cost to engage in this activity would be significantly greater if I were to choose not to sign this release, and agree that the opportunity to participate at the stated cost in return for the execution of this release is a reasonable bargain. #### **Standards and Agreement:**

PARENTS/GUARDIANS: Please review the following standards agreement with your camper. By signing your child up for camp you and your child agree to the rules listed below. MUCC and the Michigan Out-of-Doors Youth Camp staff take pride in providing a safe and fun place to learn and explore while at camp.

Electronic devices such as Ipods, handheld game systems, and CELL PHONES are not allowed at camp. YOUR CHILD IS NOT ALLOWED TO KEEP THEIR CELL PHONES FOR ANY REASON. THESE ITEMS WILL BE CONFISCATED AND RETURNED TO THE GUARDIAN AT THE END OF THE DAY

Here are several things that WILL NOT BE TOLERATED at camp for the safety of all.

- 1. Consumption or possession of alcohol, drugs or tobacco.
- 2. Foul, offensive or abusive language to another camper of staff member.
- 3. Discrimination, harassment, or cruelty to another camper or staff member.
- 4. Theft or damage to property belonging to another camper, staff member or facility.
- 5. Physical relationships between any camper/camper or camper/staff.
- 6. Bodily harm or violence or any kind to another camper or staff member.
- 7. Consistent disregard for safety rules or disruption of camp activities.
- 8. Possession of any weapon, including pocket knives.

IF A CAMPER IS FOUND TO HAVE VIOLATED ANY OF THE ABOVE RULES, THE CAMPER WILL BE REQUIRED TO LEAVE CAMP. THE PARENT OR GAURDIAN WILL BE CALLED AND WILL BE RESPONSIBLE FOR REMOVING THE CAMPER IMMEDIATELY. THERE WILL BE NO REFUND OF ANY CAMP FEES.
